

The Reynolds City Council met in regular session on Monday, October 3, 2021, at 7:00 pm. Member's present were Dorian Beck, Linda Dockter, David Scholand, Brian Thompson with Lloyd Kennedy presiding.

Public Works, Health & Safety:

Sewer Report from Dorian Beck: pump #1 and #2 both ran 10 hours.

Research is being gathered to request a bid from Culinex for bathroom stall dividers in the park shelter restrooms. A request to place a permanent fire pit in the park is being researched. Slabs of cement to place metal tables on at the park was discussed with concerns of leveling and placing the slabs properly.

A motion by David Scholand to approve the consent agenda, was seconded by Brian Thompson, and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Online bill pay is now operational on the city website. Residents can submit their utility payments online with a check, credit, or debit card.

The first of two payments for the American Rescue Plan Act for Cities was received.

The First State Bank loan for the city lots renewed for 5 years with quarterly payments.

An abandoned trailer house on the Moen property is legally registered to Earnest & Hildegard Klankowski (both deceased). Contact will be made with Moen's to find a solution for removing the trailer.

New Business:

The 2022 budget was presented for final approval. A motion was made by David Scholand to accept the budget without changes, was seconded by Dorian Beck, and passed unanimously.

Water meters will be removed from the park shelter and ball diamond for winter.

Fall cleanup day is October 14, 2021, from 4 to 8 pm at the old gas station.

Motion to adjourn by David Scholand, seconded by Dorian Beck, and passed unanimously.
