

The Reynolds City Council met in regular session on Monday, February 7, 2022, at 7:00 pm. Member's present were Dorian Beck, Linda Dockter, David Scholand, Brian Thompson with Lloyd Kennedy presiding. The minutes from the January 1, 2022, meeting were read.

**Public Works, Health & Safety:**

Also, a letter will be sent to the owner of 411 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, regarding the garage that is in disrepair.

The 2022 contract with ND Sewage Pump & Lift Station was approved.
