

The Reynolds Board of Equalization met during the regular session on May 1, 2023, at 7 pm. Members present were Brian Thompson, Dorian Beck, Linda Dockter, and Braden Majer with David Scholand presiding.

The minutes from the April meeting were presented.

The following bills were presented for payment: First State Bank \$381.11 & 10,695.02; Xcel \$1,516.40 & \$248.56; Waste Management \$5,063.44; Jennifer Skold \$719.92 & \$322.26; East Central Water \$120; Traill County Sheriff \$250; Hillsboro Banner \$265.47; ND State Tax Comm \$51; ND Job Service \$26.88; Menards \$136.18; Office Depot \$168.02; Neil Thompson \$200; Larry Linneman \$1,350, and QuickBooks \$682.50.

Public Works, Health & Safety:

Sewer Report from Dorian Beck: pump 1 ran for 28 hours and pump 2 ran for 27 hours. A motion by Dorian Beck to approve the consent agenda was seconded by Linda Dockter and passed unanimously.

Old Business: A quote from H&S Electrical Services was presented for the purchase and installation of a 32kw generator. The propane-powered genset with an automatic transfer switch will be installed at the sewer lift station. Dorian Beck made a motion to accept proposal #1, was seconded by Brian Thompson and passed unanimously.

New Business: Jordan and Abby Adams submitted plans and requested a building permit to build a home in The Reynolds Second Edition. Brian Thompson made a motion to approve the request, which was seconded by Linda Dockter and passed unanimously.

A request for a restricted event special permit for the Mayer – Deschene wedding was presented. The fee was set at \$25 for the permit. Brian Thompson made a motion to approve the request, it was seconded by Dorian Beck and passed unanimously. Renters must also provide private security for the event. Security must be a registered peace officer or a licensed security guard.

The Beehive requested approval from the City of Reynolds to hold a street dance on July 29, 2023, on Main Street. Approval was granted as long as Grand Forks and Traill County approved the request.

A request from the Central Valley FBLA was presented. Linda Dockter made a motion to give \$400, which was seconded by Braden Majer and passed unanimously.

A request to split the cost to gravel the township road past the lagoon was received from Buxton Township. Council Members will look for other areas that need gravel. The city will continue the mowing agreement for the Century Link building without change. The culvert across from the Valley United Co-op elevator will need to be repaired. Two thank-you gift certificates will be sent for the loan of equipment and street maintenance. A thank you note was received from the CV Post Prom students for the donation. Also, Steve Hunt personally thanked the council for allowing him to use the building for Hunter Safety.

Motion to adjourn by Brian Thompson, seconded by Dorian Beck, and passed unanimously.
