

REYNOLDS CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

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The Reynolds City Council met in regular session on Monday, June 6, 2022, at 7:00 pm. Member's present were David Scholand, Brian Thompson, Linda Dockter, Dorian Beck with Lloyd Kennedy presiding. The minutes from the May 2, 2022, meeting were read.

The following bills were presented for payment: Ferrellgas \$200.12; Postmaster \$84; Traill County Tribune \$113.50; Midcontinent \$4.20; Xcel \$1,309.67; Waste Management \$2,912.45; Jennifer Skold \$719.92; East Central Water \$160; First State Bank \$10,000 & \$231.93; Traill County Sheriff \$250; Everett Severinson \$242.41 & \$180, David Scholand \$300; Thompson Farmers Oil \$109; Dakota Joe's \$640.74; Larry P Linneman \$315, and Valley United \$95.21.

Public Works, Health & Safety:

A Main Street Beautification grant was received from the Traill County EDC for \$999. A matching donation will be made from the Reynolds Community Betterment to purchase and plant trees along main street.

Sewer Report from Dorian Beck: pump #1 ran 174 hours and pump #2 ran 186 hours. A motion by David Scholand to approve the consent agenda, was seconded by Brian Thompson, and passed unanimously.

Public Hearing:

A public hearing was held starting at 7:10 pm to receive comments or questions regarding the petition to vacate the streets and alleys south of 1st Avenue and east of Russell Street. No comments or questions were received, and public hearing closed at 7:32 pm.

Old Business:

Assessor position for the city is open.

New Business:

After discussion regarding wages paid to City employees, David Scholand made a motion to raise the City Council and City employees to \$20 per hour. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Discussion was held on cleaning and repairing or replacing city culverts on approximately 6 to 10 blocks. Council members will look to see what areas are of the most concern. They will select blocks or streets based on need. Bids will be gathered for the properties selected. Private approaches are the citizens responsibility.

A motion to apply dust control to the city streets was made by Brian Thompson and seconded by Dorian Beck and passed unanimously. Street sweeping is scheduled for the middle of June.

Organization Meeting – June 28th at 7 pm at City Hall – Newly elected officials sworn in. July Council meeting will be on July 5th at 7 pm due to the holiday.

The city lawn mower is old and needs to be either replaced or a new engine. Research will be collected to purchase a mower with a 48-inch deck and presented at the July meeting.

Motion to adjourn by David Scholand, seconded by Dorian Beck, and passed unanimously.
