

The Reynolds City Council met in regular session on September 6, 2022, at 7:00 pm. Member's present were Linda Dockter, Brian Thompson, Dorian Beck and Braden Majer with David Scholand presiding. The minutes from the August 1st meeting were read.

Public Works, Health & Safety:

Sewer Report from Dorian Beck: pump #1 ran 12 hours and pump #2 ran 13 hours. The trees have been planted on main street. A motion by Dorian Beck to approve the consent agenda, was seconded by Brian Thompson, and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Dorian Beck reported on the generator for the lift station. A proposal that would be all inclusive does not appear to be an option. He has been in discussion with Tim Nelson at Cat to get an updated bid. Inquiries will be made to area electricians to wire the project.

The 2023 Preliminary Budget was presented for review. The first draft had an error and was corrected therefore reducing the budget by \$10,800.

A second round of letters will be sent to residents that have a past due balance from 2021 on their account. They will be informed if their account is not paid it will be applied to their property taxes as a special assessment.

New Business:

A Budget Hearing will be held on October 8, 2022, at 7pm at City Hall.

The Beehive Bar inquired about renting the City Hall to host a bean bag league during the winter. A weekly rental rate was set with the Beehive responsible for cleaning after each event.

Fall cleanup will be scheduled for the first week of October. With current labor shortages the cleanup will be held during the week.

Motion to adjourn by Brian Thompson, seconded by Dorian Beck, and passed unanimously.
